

I made this book up for myself of the different attractions / destinations which we have, personally, enjoyed going to. Upon finishing it, I decided to share with others who may also enjoy some of the destinations. These are not solely for motorcyclists, anyone can enjoy. For the most part I have included phone numbers, addresses, hours of operation, & miles from Wichita.

As you plot a desired destination, see if it is possible to "bundle" a trip with various stops. For example, a road trip to Eskimo Joe's would put you in close proximity of POP's in Arcadia, OK. - P L U S (depending on your route) one could ride through Dexter, KS and stop at the Henry's Candy Store. Another example: either going to or from Sturgis, S.D., stop at the Corn Palace in Mitchell, S.D. just off I-90. Another example: Council Grove offers much more than just good food. Don't short change yourself on what the city has to offer and what you will ride by enroute to Council Grove (see page 3).

Take someone with you to share the ride and submit an article to the newsletter editor. Your "spin" on the ride may encourage others to go. Load the addresses and or coordinates into your GPS, GOOGLE the destination(s) to learn a little more about it, and head out. I realize that both time in the saddle and distance from home will have a bearing on how much riding you will be up to.

Google How Far is it Between, select How Far is it Between - Free Map Tools, shows distance by land transport & zoomable to size map/route.

Google Get-Direction.com, select Get Directions, converts latitude & longitude to address and (vice versa) address to latitude & longitude. Format is DDD (decimal degrees).

Set these both as ICONS for future reference.

The trip, itself, to Council Grove offers several interesting points: long hand laid rock fences, Prairie Tallgrass Preserve is an old working farm where you can tour the house, barn, and land of native grasses. Just north of there is an old 1 room schoolhouse. In Strong City is an old courthouse still in use. One of the restaurants in Council Grove serves meals from that particular era, being cooked and prepared just as it was back in the time. While at this restaurant you can tour the bldg as well as others on the grounds within walking distance.





5 State Run Map



Sam Butcher, like George Lucas, has gone back over time and altered his original masterpiece, adding Precious Moments versions of his mother, military personnel, and others who have died. Young people in our group were invited to sit next to the mural and "imagine yourself" as part of it. "This is so sad," said one, a cheerleader. In a pew-filled back room, still part of the tour, there is a tribute to Sam's son, Philip, who died in a car crash. One wall is filled with a painting of Philip's bedroom. Above his empty bed, on puffy clouds, baby angels hold signs reading, "Welcome Home, Philip." Philip was 27 when he died, but nowhere in the room is he shown as an adult. Other rooms display pictures of dead people, mostly children, who have been turned into Precious Moments caricatures. Their portraits are provided as a reference if you want to go back into the chapel to find them. 
The Oldfield Opry began on a cold January night in 1977. It was held in a vacant store building owned by John W. Walker located at the junction of Highway 125 and Highway T in Oldfield, Missouri. The band consisted of four local musicians - Hank Thompson, Bill Gardner, Steve Beyers and Johnny Walker. The audience on that first night only slightly outnumbered the band. However, the crowd began to grow in the next few weeks and months. It wasn't long before the crowd outgrew the building which seated 50-60 people. In March of 1990 a fundraising drive began to raise money to build a new building for the Oldfield Opry. Construction began on the new building in August of that year. The building was built with labor donated by many members of the surrounding communities. The Oldfield Opry moved into its new building in December of 1990. The building seated 200 people and had central heating and air conditioning. It even had running water and indoor restrooms!

Admission to the Oldfield Opry is by donation only. A wonderful group of ladies bake pies and many volunteers work the concessions. The Oldfield Opry is known far and wide for its homemade pies. Many volunteers also act as ushers and help cleanup after the show. The musicians literally "sing for their supper." The Oldfield Opry is a "labor of love."

Throughout the years the Oldfield Opry has entertained audiences from all 50 of the United States and many foreign countries.

The first verse of the theme song tells it all: *"Come on out to Oldfield on a Saturday night, you won't see no drinkin' and you won't see no fights, just good friends and neighbors, they'll sure treat you right, at the Oldfield Opry on a Saturday night".*





Golden Pioneer Museum is at SR 86 and SR J at the northern edge of town. Don't let the faded yellow metal exterior fool you; this museum contains an extensive and impressive collection of artifacts. Neatly displayed in glass cases are pre-Columbian, Aztec and Oaxacan black pottery, razor-sharp obsidian knives, axes, arrowheads, miniature clay figures and beautiful pieces of quartz (including a cluster that weighs more than 1,250 lbs.). Other objects are giant mastodon teeth and bones, pocket watches in mint condition, antique Kewpie dolls and a coin collection featuring the first U.S. silver dollar and some 3-cent nickels. One highlight is a beautiful turquoise carving, said to be the world's largest. Historical exhibits pay tribute to the Native Americans who died during the 1837 Trail of Tears forced westward migration. The museum also has plenty of 20th-century Americana—Elvis displays, a huge collection of 1960s lunch boxes, baseball cards, and hundreds of antique glass plates and pitchers in vivid colors.




